

The City of Lafayette's Three Cart Program

- ▶ Weekly compost collection.
- ▶ One free compost cart exchange annually. If requested more often, an additional fee will apply.
- ▶ Continued collection of recycling every other week. Please refer to the calendar in this booklet.
- ▶ Your monthly rate depends on your garbage cart size; the rate includes recycling and compost collection service at no additional cost.
- ▶ More cart size choices for recycling and compost carts: 32-, 64- or 96-gallon.

Empty, clean and dry. Place items loose in your recycling cart, not in bags.

Empty plastic bottles, jugs and tubs





Cart exchange requests will be accepted through the 25th of the month. The cart change out and rate change will occur the 1st of the following month.

New Changes to the Front Range Compost Program

Composting Guidelines Have Been Updated and Simplified. **Food Scraps and Yard and Plant Trimmings Only.**

Compost haulers like Republic Services and cities all along the Front Range are working with regional compost processor A1 Organics to create a high-quality, clean-finished compost product. Early in 2023, A1 Organics announced changes due to widespread contamination (materials placed in the wrong cart) that apply to all cities and towns in the region.

It is extremely difficult for A1 Organics to separate contamination (i.e. clothing, diapers, pet waste, glass, plastics, etc.) at their facility, due to the number of unacceptable materials entering their facility and the difficulty of manually sorting these unwanted items out of the finished product.

As of April 1, 2023, compostable service ware, paper products and compostable bags larger than 3 gallons will no longer be accepted in residential and commercial compost carts.

The City of Lafayette's goal is to provide A1 organics with contamination-free material, and we need your help! Please call Republic Services at **303.286.2400** or visit **RepublicServices.com/municipality/Lafayette-CO** or **Ecocycle.org** with any questions about these changes.



What Can and Can't Be Placed in Your Compost Cart

✓ Acceptable Compost Items

- Remove all decals, stickers, rubber bands, twist-ties and anything that is not food
- Place all yard waste loose in your compost cart unbagged. 3-gallon approved compostable bags can be used to collect food scraps.

COMPOST AND MULCH GIVEAWAY

- ▶ **Saturday, April 13, 2024**, 9 a.m. – 1 p.m., Lafayette Service Center, 1700 Avalon Avenue

CURBSIDE LEAF AND BRANCH CLEANUP

- ▶ Includes pickup of up to 20 compostable or brown/kraft paper yard waste bags and 5 bundles of shrubbery and tree limbs cut to no more than 4 feet in length and no more than 18 inches in diameter, tied with twine or rope.

Spring:

- ▶ **Saturday, April 6** – Residents east of Highway 287
- ▶ **Saturday, April 13** – Residents west of Highway 287

Fall:

- ▶ **Saturday, November 9** – Residents east of Highway 287
- ▶ **Saturday, November 16** – Residents west of Highway 287

HARD-TO-RECYCLE EVENT

- ▶ **Saturday, April 20**, 9 a.m. – 1 p.m., Flatirons Church, 201 Waneka Parkway (back parking lot) – enter off South Boulder Road
- ▶ Examples of hard-to-recycle items include Styrofoam™, electronics, batteries, cleaning supplies, paper for shredding, and more.

EARTH DAY EVERY DAY

- ▶ **Saturday, April 27**, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m., Outdoor Classroom, 105 W Baseline Road
Family-friendly event to enjoy the outdoors, protect the Earth, and create a more sustainable Lafayette.
- ▶ Get the opportunity to sit in a recycle truck!

ANNUAL BULK ITEM CLEANUP

- ▶ **Saturday, September 21** – Residents east of Highway 287
- ▶ **Saturday, September 28** – Residents west of Highway 287
- ▶ Place up to 5 items curbside by 7 a.m. Examples of bulk items include Mattresses, box springs, sofas, chairs, other furniture, and large household appliances that do not contain Freon®.

Cleanup Guidelines (place items out by 7 a.m.)

- ▶ Leave items out regardless of the weather.
- ▶ Place items curbside in the street gutter.
- ▶ Place leaves in compostable or brown/kraft paper yard waste bags.
- ▶ Bundle tree limbs/brush with twine/rope. Bundles cannot be more than 4' in length and 18" in diameter.

Unacceptable Cleanup Items

- ✗ Items that are placed on sidewalk, driveway, yard or alley
- ✗ Leaves placed in plastic bags
- ✗ Tree stumps placed curbside
- ✗ Bundles thicker than 18" in diameter
- ✗ Tree limbs/brush that are not bundled with twine/rope

Recycling and Composting Tips

Recycling Tips

- ▶ Empty plastic prescription bottles with caps reattached can be placed in your curbside recycling cart.
- ▶ Plastic shopping bags are not recyclable and can jam the sorting machine at the recycling facility.

Hard-to-Recycle Items

- ▶ If you need to dispose of Freon®-containing appliances (like refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners), please contact Eco-Cycle CHaRM at **303.444.6634** (6400 Arapahoe Road, Boulder, CO 80303).
- ▶ Annual Hard-to-Recycle Event. Registration is required. More information in early 2024.

Composting Tips

- ▶ When cleaning your compost cart, use a hose and natural cleaner (soap can damage the local ecosystem).
- ▶ Use vinegar, lemon juice and baking soda to sanitize and deodorize your cart.
- ▶ Apply finished compost to your garden area about 2-4 weeks before you plant, giving the compost time to integrate and stabilize within the soil.
- ▶ Lawn clippings and food scraps are about 80% water and need to be mixed with woody waste to keep from becoming a slimy mess. Alternate green and brown waste in your compost cart.


Bulk Items

Bulk items are defined as items set out for curbside collection that do not fit in a 32-gallon cart. Appliances containing Freon®, electronic items and/or hazardous waste will not be collected.

| Material | Accepted | Not Accepted |
|--------------|--|---|
| Landscape | Branches bundled with twine and cut to 4' lengths. Bagged yard clippings and leaves/mulch no more than 50 lbs. | Concrete, dirt, large stumps, fertilizers, chemicals and rocks |
| Construction | Wood, drywall, windows, doors, decking, carpet and flooring | Concrete, bricks, paints/stains and chemicals |
| Metal | Small appliances, metal flashing, metal furniture and household metals | Refrigerators, freezers, A/C units, any appliance with Freon® and lawn mowers |
| Household | Household garbage, furniture, linens, clothes, toys, bikes and play equipment broken down to 4' pieces | Hazardous and bio-hazardous waste, needles, syringes and hot tubs |
| Automotive | Bumpers, auto body panels, seats and upholstery | Tires, car/truck batteries, vehicle fluids, motor oil plastic containers and windshield glass |
| Electronics | N/A | All electronics including TVs |

Cart Placement

- ▶ Please place carts out for service by 7 a.m.
- ▶ Place carts at least 3 feet apart and 5 feet between any other objects at the curb.
- ▶ Place cart with front of cart facing street or alley.
- ▶ Please avoid placing carts under overhangs and wires.
- ▶ Remove carts from street or alley as soon as possible after collection.




