State of California Recycling Requirements: AB 1826, AB 341 & SB 1383

Assembly Bill 1826 (AB 1826), also known as the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (MORe) law, became effective April 1, 2016. AB1826 requires that all businesses that generate two (2) cubic yards or more of solid waste per week and multi-family dwellings of five or more units have an organics recycling program.

Assembly Bill 341 (AB 341), also known as the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (MCR) law, became effective July 1, 2012. AB341 requires that all businesses that generate four (4) cubic yards or more of solid waste per week and multifamily dwellings of five or more units have a traditional recycling program.

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383), also known as California's Mandatory Organics Recycling Law, became effective January 1, 2022. SB 1383 requires all residents, businesses and apartments to have an organics recycling cart/dumpster. The cart/dumpster will include food waste and yard waste.

Fresno County Unincorporated Annual Drop-Off Event for 2025

The Fresno County On-Call Coupon Program has transitioned to a county-funded community cleanup drop-off event, and Republic Services is offering Unincorporated Fresno County residents the opportunity to dispose of large items and certain appliances at no cost during an upcoming cleanup event for your area.

Residents of Unincorporated Fresno County must provide a county-issued coupon at the event to participate at no charge. Residents without a coupon may be responsible for the cost of disposal. Please contact the Fresno County Resources Division at **559.600.4259** to obtain a coupon prior to your scheduled date. Republic Services has scheduled drop-off dates for your neighborhood at the Rice Road Transfer Station, located at 10463 N. Rice Road, Fresno, CA 93730 (off of highway 41 and Friant Ave.), from 8:30 a.m. - 2 p.m. Please contact our office at **559.275.1551** if you have questions about which date is scheduled for you.

What Is Accepted at the Drop-Off Site

Unincorporated Fresno County residents can drop off a maximum of two (2) cubic yards of waste, including white goods and electronic waste. This is approximately equal to the back of a full-size pickup truck, level with the top of the bed. Residents may also drop off one (1) Freon®-containing appliance (refrigerator or freezer) and three (3) mattresses at no cost. For more information, please contact Republic Services at **559.434.9211**. To verify residency, please bring an ID with your current address, along with a copy of your bill.

Fees Will Apply to the Following*

Please call Republic Services at **559.434.9211** for the most accurate rates.

- Appliances/white goods and mattresses (over the allotted number) will be \$35.01 each
- Vehicle tires 20" or smaller will be \$17.57 per tire
- Truck/tractor tires 20" or larger will be \$17.57 per tire
- Electronics (computer monitors, TVs, etc.) can count toward the allowed 2 cubic yards. Electronics will be charged \$8.85 per item over the allowed 2 cubic yards
- Any material over the allotted 2 cubic yards will be assessed at scale house rates:

\$50.58 up to first 1,000 lbs.* \$77.36 per ton (2,000 lbs.) or a portion of*

*Environmental and fuel recovery fees will be applied per load. Rates are subject to change without notice. No cash accepted; only credit cards or checks. To verify residency, please bring an ID with your current address, along with a copy of your bill. No hazardous chemicals or waste allowed.

Tips for Keeping Our Neighborhood Clean

- Close the lids on all your carts
- Bag trash before placing it in your cart
- Toss only loose recyclables into the recycling cart
- Only put recyclables in the recycling cart.

- Break down and flatten boxes
- Empty food and beverage containers. Wipe or rinse out food residue, as needed

- Do not leave the cart lids open
- Do not place bagged trash on top of your cart
- Do not bag your recyclables
- Do not over-fill carts. If you need additional carts, please contact customer service
- Do not place plastic bags in the recycling. Instead bundle them together, and return them to your local grocery store, or place them in your trash cart
