## Moving Out? Good Luck with the Move!

It can be challenging when packing and moving to deal with all the “stuff,” but there are resources that can help. Check out the list below to find out what to do with unwanted materials such as recyclables, clothing, household goods, and household hazardous waste.

### How to Reduce Waste—Recyclables

Place empty and clean recyclables in the on-site recycling containers. ### How to Reduce Waste—Household Goods and Furniture

If you have items you want to get rid of that still may be of use to someone else, please consider alternatives to throwing them in the landfill by sharing on the networks listed below.

- **Craigslist** features community classifieds. Postings are free. Visit: [www.craigslist.org](http://www.craigslist.org).
- **Freecycle Network** is a grassroots service of people looking to give and get stuff free, like moving boxes. Each local online group is moderated by a volunteer. Membership is free. Visit: [www.freecycle.org](http://www.freecycle.org) (Be sure to type in “.org” and not “.com,” an imposter site).
- **LetGo** and **Facebook Marketplace** are convenient ways to buy and sell local second-hand goods. Visit [www.letgo.com](http://www.letgo.com) and [www.facebook.com](http://www.facebook.com) marketplace for more information.
- **Nextdoor** is a community-based website and app that helps connect neighbors on a variety of topics, and features a “For Sale and Free” section. Find out more at [www.nextdoor.com](http://www.nextdoor.com).

- Recycle mattresses at the Republic Services Contra Costa Transfer Station for a fee or schedule bulky item pick up with your property manager. For more information and pricing, call (925) 685-4711.

# How to Reduce Waste— Household Hazardous Waste / Electronic Waste

It is illegal to throw toxic household waste into the trash, down the drain, or into the gutter because it can injure or harm trash collectors, contaminate water and soil, and disrupt sewage treatment. Although moving is a very hectic time, please take care to dispose of your unwanted HHW properly. Hazardous wastes such as paint products, solvents, cleaners, and pesticides can be taken to the Central Contra Costa Sanitary District's facility at 4797 Imhoff Place, Martinez.
