Additional Service Offerings

- **Free Motor Oil Recycling Kits**—Your Republic Services driver will deliver a new Motor Oil and Filter Recovery Kit upon request. Tenants must call Republic Services to order a Motor Oil and Filter Recovery Kit to be delivered to their unit address. Republic Services will work with property managers on proper set-out location and other collection details.
- **Free Recycling Tote Bags**—Each multi-family residence is entitled to one free recycling tote bag to use for indoor storage of recyclables and transport to outdoor collection carts. Contact Republic Services for more information.
- **Cooking Oil Recycling Drop-Off**—Visit our Fremont office for free disposal of cooking oil and grease.

- **Free On-Call Bulky Boxes**—Multi-family properties can receive up to four 20-yard bulky boxes per year. Please contact your property manager if your property needs a bulky box.

Recycling

Mixed paper (magazines, newspaper, office paper, junk mail, cardboard), aluminum cans, small scrap metal, clean aluminum foil and trays, empty glass bottles and jars, empty plastic bottles, empty plastic containers #1-#7
Must be empty, clean and dry



Organics

Yard waste, all food scraps and some food-soiled paper



Landfill

Non-recyclables, non-organics



✗ No: Dirty recyclable containers, trash, food waste and food-soiled paper (paper towels and napkins, paper cups and plates, pizza boxes), Styrofoam™ containers, plates or cups, treated wood, pallets, landscape waste or plant debris, restroom waste, hazardous or medical waste, construction debris, concrete, asphalt, dirt, shoes, clothing or textiles, diapers

✗ No: Plastic or plastic bags, glass, metals or foil, liquids, oil/grease, diapers, restroom waste, pet waste or cat litter, palm fronds, cactus, tree stumps, dirt/sod, plastic-coated paper products (plates or cups), single-serve coffee pods, hazardous waste or trash

✗ No: Batteries, fluorescent tubes, hazardous and medical waste, sharps (needles, syringes), liquids/oil/grease, appliances and electronics, concrete, asphalt, dirt, construction debris, tires
