

Recycling is in a crisis!

- ❖ International processors are accepting only recycling loads with less than 1% non-recyclables.
- Materials market prices have plummeted.
- ❖ Many U.S. processors are going out of business.
- Recycling loads must be cleaner to be accepted for processing and remanufacturing.

What's happening in West County now?

- Recycling containers are being used for garbage–for instance:
 - Soiled diapers
 - o Kitty litter and pet waste
 - o Food scraps and green waste
 - Shoes, clothing
 - o E-waste, Universal waste
 - Construction debris
- Contamination levels in West County range from 15% to 45%.



What is Republic Services doing to help eliminate recycling contamination?

- Providing information on proper materials separation.
- Conducting visual audits of recycling containers throughout West County.
- Contaminated recycling containers are photographed.
- Contaminated containers are "tagged" with notices and Service Guides listing items accepted in curbside collection.
- If trash is found in residential recycling carts, a **surcharge of \$27.75 per cart** may appear on your next bill.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP?

- ✓ Take personal responsibility—keep trash out of your recycling containers.
 - Put materials in the right containers:
 - Place recyclables loose in the recycling container.
 - o Plastic bags / thin films must be placed in a large clear plastic bag and tied off.
 - Put food soiled paper (napkins/paper food boxes) in the trash or organics container (if you have one).
 - Wipe or scrape food residue out of containers.
 - Keep food containers, paper and plastic *Empty, Clean and DryTM*
- ✓ And most of all: NO garbage in recycling containers!
