Pressure-Treated Wood

Pressure-treated wood (CCA) is wood treated with chemicals to protect it from rotting, due to insects and microbial agents (typically includes decks, docks, fences, playgrounds, landscaping timbers, utility poles and railroad ties). **Republic Services cannot pick up pressure-treated wood with yard waste. All pressure-treated wood must go to the Brevard's Central Disposal Facility located at 2250 Adamson Road, Cocoa, FL.**

Landscape Contractors/ Land Clearing

Land clearing debris means any waste generated by removing debris, logs, trees, brush or demolition material from any site in preparation for land improvement or construction projects. **Landscape companies and services must remove their generated debris. Republic Services is not responsible for the collection of land clearing debris.**



Household Hazardous Waste Products in the Home:

- Aerosol sprays (hair/paint/ bug and oven cleaner)
- Adhesives
- Drain cleaner
- Electronics (10 large electronics per household per year)
- Fluorescent lamps (10 each per household per year)
- CFLs
- Health and beauty aids (polish and remover, rubbing alcohol, peroxide)
- Mercury-containing devices (thermometers/thermostats)
- Rechargeable batteries (NiCad, lithium/button)



Household Hazardous Waste Products Around the Home/in the Garage:

- Auto fluids (antifreeze, brake/power steering, motor oil)
- Auto/boat batteries
- Boat flares
- Gasoline/diesel
- Lighter fluid
- Lubricants
- Oil filters
- Paints/stains/thinners/sealers/solvents
- Roof coatings
