

RECYCLING

Put these items in your recycling cart. Remember to make sure they are **Empty, Clean and Dry** and free of food, debris, and liquid residues.

Uniform Statewide Collection List

You can safely put these items in your curbside recycle cart.



Corrugated cardboard
(uncoated and recycle-compatible coated; clean pizza boxes OK)



Molded pulp packaging
(e.g., egg cartons, but not food serveware or flower pots)



All kraft paper
(brown paper bags, mailers)



Paperboard packaging
(e.g., cereal, cracker and medicine boxes)



Polycoated cartons
(e.g., milk cartons), aseptic cartons



Tissue paper used as packaging
(not facial or sanitary tissue)



Non-metalized gift wrap
(no ribbons or bows)



High-grade office paper
(e.g., white and colored ledger)



Newspaper/
newsprint



Magazines, catalogs and
similar glossy paper



Telephone
directories



Paperback
books



Other printing and writing
paper (e.g., envelopes,
"junk mail", cards)



Aluminum food and
beverage cans



Steel cans, including
empty/dry paint cans



Nursery (plant) packaging:
HDPE (#2) and PP (#5) only



Scrap metal less than 10
pounds in weight and 18
inches in length; excluding
sharp items and "tanglers"
(e.g., bicycle chains, wire)



Plastic tubs (e.g., cottage
cheese) larger than 2
inches in two dimensions,
made of PET (#1), HDPE
(#2), or polypropylene (#5)



Plastic bottles larger than
2 inches in two dimensions,
made of clear PET (#1),
natural or colored HDPE
(#2) or clear or colored
polypropylene (#5) (caps
OK if screwed on)



Plastic buckets, pails,
storage containers and
other bulky HDPE (#2) or
polypropylene (#5) plastic
packaging that fits loosely
in the provided on-route
collection container

Cart Color: Brown | **Cart Size:** 64-gallon
How to prepare your recyclables:

- All containers, bottles, cans and jars should be empty, clean and dry
- All recycling should go into the recycling cart
- No food waste, liquid or plastic bags
- Do NOT bag or box recyclables; leave loose
- All recyclables should fit in your recycling cart with the lid closed (if you have large cardboard, bring it to our Recycling Depot)
